Q1 Later this month there will be caucuses to choose Presidential candidates in Nevada. The Democratic caucus is on Saturday, February 20th and the Republican caucus is on Tuesday, February 23rd. How likely would you say you are to vote in one of these caucuses? Are you certain to vote, will you probably vote, are the chances 50/50, or will you probably not vote?

If you strongly oppose it, press 4. If you're not sure, press 5.
